DISCUSSION ON SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO)

The Town Board discussed the current arrangement for the School Resource Officer. The Town of Sullivan helps fund three (3) School Resource Officers as per the request of the Chittenango School District. The payment has been disbursed out of the Host Community Funds that the Town

receives. The Town receives Host Community Funds approximately in November of each year. Since these funds are used to pay the Madison County Sheriff's Office the Town will enter into a new agreement for 2021 that is to be signed by the Town, Chittenango Central School District, Madison County and Madison County Sherriff's Office. The Town would like the language in this new agreement to reflect the request to have Madison County administer the payment to the Sheriff's office directly, out of the Town's Host Community Funds. The Town would receive a report annually when Host Community Funds are received, to show the amount paid out of Town funds to pay the Sheriff's Office for these officers.

PARKS BUILDING AND GREEN TEAM QUOTE

It was reported that the Parks Department needs to update the lighting within the offices. Green Team has submitted a quote for \$1,456.73. The work will be starting soon to convert the Parks Department's lights to LED in order to conserve energy costs.

BUDGET MODIFICATIONS

Grant Funds received from NYS EFC - GIGP \$68,019.36. Due to this revenue being a grant, these funds are being placed in an appropriation line to expense.

Transferring \$24,509.47 from A3097 St. Aid Capital Projects into A8030.460 Engineering.
