The Receiver of Taxes for the Town of Sullivan is an appointed position by the Town of Sullivan Town Board. The position is an annual appointment and only collects the Town & County (Property) Taxes for the Town of Sullivan. For any information or questions regarding School Taxes, please contact the school district where you reside for further information.

As a friendly reminder, it is the responsibility of the property owner to ensure timely payment of all taxes.

<u>Copies of Tax Receipts/Bills:</u> Copies of paid tax receipts are available upon request. If you are mailing in your payment and would like a receipt, please include a stamped self-addressed envelope with your payment. For in-person payments, Community Bank will be able to provide the taxpayer a receipt after the transaction is complete. # **2021 Tax Collection & Guidelines:**

Town & County Taxes will be mailed out by December 26, 2020. Collection of payments can begin on December 26, 2020. No payments will be accepted at the Town of Sullivan Offices. The two ways payment can be made are as follows:

- 1.) In Person Payments: Payment can be made at Community Bank located at 519 W. Genesee Street, Chittenango, NY 13037. Due to the current pandemic the bank lobby is temporarily closed for the foreseeable future, in-person payments will have to be paid via the drive through during business hours. The Drive Through Hours are: Monday- Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturday 9 a.m. to Noon. For any questions regarding bank hours please call Community Bank at (315) 687-3921.
- 2.) Mail in Payments: All mail in payments can be sent to:

Please make checks payable to the Receiver of Taxes. If you would like a paid receipt to verify that your taxes have been paid, please include a stamped self-addressed envelope with your payment.

\*Please Note: No in-person payments will be accepted at the Town of Sullivan Office Building. Do not use the blue drop box in front of the Town Offices, that drop box is not a mailbox. Any payments that are left in that drop box will not be accepted and will be returned to the taxpayer.

**Payment Guidelines:** The deadline to pay Town & County taxes without any penalties is January 31<sup>st</sup>. As long as mail-in payments are posted on or before January 31<sup>st</sup> no penalties will be applied. Any payments made in person or posted after January 31<sup>st</sup> will adhere to the following penalty schedule:

```
February 1<sup>st</sup> – February 28<sup>th</sup> a penalty of 1% will be applied March 1<sup>st</sup> – March 31<sup>st</sup> a penalty of 2% will be applied April 1<sup>st</sup> – April 30<sup>th</sup> a penalty of 3% will be applied
```

After April 30<sup>th</sup> the Town of Sullivan's Tax Warrant will expire and no payments will be accepted after that date. All unpaid tax bills will be turned over to Madison County where additional penalties and interest will be applied. Any payments that need to be made after the April 30<sup>th</sup> deadline will have to be paid directly to the Madison County Treasurer's Office. Call (315) 366-2371 for further details on payments after April 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Tax Installment Payments:** If your bill exceeds \$100.00 you are able to pay your tax bill in two equal installments. The first installment payment has to be exactly 50% of the overall bill and must be made during the penalty free period, on or before January 31st. After January 31st the option to pay your tax bill in two equal installments will not be available. The second installment payment will also adhere to the same penalty schedule for the remaining balance.

```
1% penalty starting February 1<sup>st</sup> through February 28<sup>th</sup> 2% penalty starting March 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup> 3% penalty starting April 1<sup>st</sup> through April 30<sup>th</sup>
```

If the second installment is not paid by April 30<sup>th</sup> then the second payment will have to be paid through the Madison County Treasurer's Office where additional interest and penalties will be applied on the remaining balance.

# **Town & County Taxes Frequently Asked Questions**

#### 1. When will I receive my tax bill?

Madison County prints the Town & County tax bills and mails them out for the Town of Sullivan. Mailing usually occurs within a day or two after Christmas. Residents should expect to receive their bill by the end of December.

## 2. Where do I pay my taxes and who do I make checks payable to?

Checks should be made out to "Receiver of Taxes." Mail payments to:

Receiver of Taxes, 7507 Lakeport Road, Chittenango, NY 13037.

In person payments are paid at Community Bank located at 519 W Genesee Street in Chittenango.

### Please note that in person payments must be made via drive-thru due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

#### 3. Can I pay my taxes online?

Currently, the Town of Sullivan does not utilize online payments for the Town & County taxes.

### 4. Do you accept partial payments?

Yes, taxpayers are able to pay their bill in two equal installments. Please refer to the tax installment guidelines for information on how to pay in installments.

#### 5. Can I pre-pay my taxes?

No, you cannot pre-pay Town & County taxes. The Receiver of Taxes or Collection Authority cannot start collecting payments until the date of their tax warrant. The warrant date will be advertised to inform residents when they can pay their taxes.

#### 6. How do I find out if my taxes are paid?

To confirm if your taxes have been paid, you can go to: <a href="http://taxlookup.net/index.aspx?county=madison">http://taxlookup.net/index.aspx?county=madison</a> and search by your name or address. You can also check the status on school taxes on the same site and will have the ability to print your receipt. You can also contact the Receiver of Taxes at 315-687-9190 for assistance.

#### 7. How do I change my mailing address on my tax bill?

Contact the Assessor's office at: 315-687-7222 to update your mailing address.

### 8. What if I do not receive my tax bill?

If you have an escrow account, then your bank received the tax bill since they will be paying the taxes. If you do not have an escrow account that would pay your tax bill, contact the Assessor's Office for assistance.

### 9. I never received my bill, or received it late; Do I still have to pay the penalty?

Yes, you will still have to pay the penalty even if you did not receive a bill or received your bill late. Under the New York State Real Property Tax Law Section 922, it is the responsibility of the property owner to know when taxes are due and payable. In addition, neither the Receiver of Taxes nor any other official has legal authority to waive statutory interest charges. Interest charges are fixed by the Real Property Tax Law.

#### 10. If I mail my payment on the due date, do I have to pay a penalty?

If your payment was posted on the due date, stamped by the post office indicting they received it on that day, then the taxpayer would not have to pay a penalty. Keep in mind, if you drop off the payment outside of the post office, there is no guarantee it will be stamped on that day and could be considered late.
