#### TOWN BOARD TOWN OF SULLIVAN REGULAR MEETING JUNE 3, 2020 6:00PM

A regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Sullivan was convened by Supervisor John Becker at 6:00 pm on June 3, 2020.

The meeting was noticed in accordance with Town Law and applicable NYS Executive Orders, to include utilization of the Zoom videoconferencing platform and simultaneously cast on YouTube Live.

Members participating via Zoom/YouTube Live were: Supervisor John Becker, Councilors John Brzuszkiewicz, Jeff Martin, Kerry Ranger, Comptroller Beth Ellis, Highway Superintendent Andy Busa. Councilor Tom Kopp was excused.

Members from Sleepy Hollow Water District and Sleepy Hollow Ext. #1 water district were present as well, via Zoom. Taylor Bottar from Barton and Loguidice was available via zoom for this meeting.

The meeting opened at 6:00 pm.

Pledge to the flag was led by Supervisor Becker.

Supervisor Becker asked everyone to remember June 6, 2020 D-Day. Our veterans and their families are close to us in our hearts and minds at this time.

#### **APPROVAL OF MAY 6, 2020 MEETING MINUTES**

A motion was duly made by Councilor Martin, seconded by Councilor Brzuszkiewicz and unanimously approved by the Board to approve the minutes from the May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Town Board meeting.

## PUBLIC HEARING FOR SLEEPY HOLLOW WATER DISTRICT INCREASE IN MAXIMUM AMOUNT TO BE EXPENDED

The public hearing was opened at 6:07 pm for the Sleepy Hollow Water District. Richard Reilly spoke and expressed he is anxious to get this project moving forward. Jim Phillips wanted to know if it is at the Comptroller's office for approval, how long would this take the project out. Attorney John Langey explained the process. Supervisor John Becker explained he would be making calls on behalf of the project to NYS. Dick Reilly said it would be helpful to have Supervisor Becker assist in this manner.

The public hearing for Sleepy Hollow Water District was closed at 6:09 pm. Motion was made by Councilor Jeff Martin and seconded by Councilor John Brzuszkiewicz.

Thereafter, Councilor John Brzuszkiewicz moved and Councilor Jeff Martin seconded the following resolution:

# RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE TOWN BOARD AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT TO BE EXPENDED FOR IMPROVEMENT OF FACILITIES IN THE SLEEPY HOLLOW WATER DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF SULLIVAN, COUNTY OF MADISON AND STATE OF NEW YORK

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Sullivan (the "Town Board" and the "Town", respectively), in the County of Madison, State of New York, has received a petition, dated April 24, 2020, pursuant to §202-d of the Town Law, requesting an increase in the amount to be expended for improvement of facilities in the existing and formed Sleepy Hollow Water District, which petition is signed by the owners of taxable real property situate in the Water District, owning in the aggregate at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property of the Water District, as shown upon the latest completed assessment roll of said Town, and including the signatures of resident owners of taxable real property owning taxable real property aggregating at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property of the Water District, owned by resident owners according to the latest completed assessment roll; and

**WHEREAS**, said petition purported to describe the boundaries of the Water District in a manner sufficient to identify the lands included therein as in a deed of conveyance and was signed by the petitioners and acknowledged or proved in the same manner as a deed to be recorded; and

**WHEREAS**, the Water District is bounded and described in the attached Schedule "A"; and

WHEREAS, following preparation of a map, plan and report by Barton and Loguidice, competent engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, for the Water District, and the construction of water facilities therein, consisting generally of approximately 2,840 linear feet of 8-inch water main; approximately 8 mainline valves; a Grundfos booster pump station and water service; two hydro-pneumatic tanks; water meter supplied by OCWA; 10 water service transfers (and 2 new water services extended to house); and approximately 20 water meters to be installed within the project area; and decommissioning and abandonment of existing water system infrastructure in the Town of Sullivan (the "water improvements"), said map, plan and report are now on file in the Office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of the water improvements is proposed to be increased from Three Hundred Eighty One Thousand Seven Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$381,700.00) to Five Hundred Forty Thousand Two Hundred Twelve and 00/100 Dollars (\$540,212.00) and the plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds of the Town to finance said cost and the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the District, which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefitted thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit conferred upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, all as shown on the attached financing plan (Schedule "B") as set forth in said Map, Plan and Report and further includes a Water

Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) Grant and an anticipated 30-year low interest DWSRF loan; and

**WHEREAS**, the increase in the maximum amount to be expended is due to generally increased costs of labor and materials; and

**WHEREAS**, the estimated cost of the District to the "typical property" (as defined in the Town Law) is One Thousand Three Hundred Six and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,306.00) (taking into account the capital/debt service, operation, maintenance, water use, user fees and county fees), annually; and that the Town Board has heretofore caused to be prepared and filed for public inspection with the Town Clerk, a detailed explanation of how such estimates were computed; and

WHEREAS, there will be no hook-up fees to the typical property in said District; and

**WHEREAS**, all future costs and expenses of operation, maintenance and improvements, in said District, including all expenses related to all extensions of said District which may thereafter be established, shall be a charge against the entire area of said District as extended; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board has heretofore caused to be prepared and filed for public inspection with the Town Clerk a detailed explanation of how such estimates were computed; and

WHEREAS, an order was adopted by the Town Board on May 6, 2020 for the hearing of all persons interested in this matter at a meeting of the Town Board to be held at the Town of Sullivan Town Hall, 7507 Lakeport Road, Chittenango, New York on June 3, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. and through the medium of Zoom, to consider an increase in the maximum amount to be expended for the Sleepy Hollow Water District and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same and for such other action on the part of the Town Board with relation thereto as may be required by law and the public hearing was as ordered and described above; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board previously gave due consideration to the impact that such construction of Water Improvements may have on the environment and on the basis of such consideration, the Town Board determined that there would be no significant impact on the environmental and issued a Negative Declaration for purposes of SEQRA; and

#### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT

#### **RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED**, that:

- A. The petition aforesaid is signed and acknowledge or proved as required by law and duly complies with the requirements of Section 202-d of the Town Law as to sufficiency of signers and it is otherwise sufficient;
- B. All the property and property owners within the District are benefitted thereby;
- C. All the property and property owners benefitted are included within the limits of the District; and
- D. It is in the public interest to increase the maximum amount to be expended for the construction of improvements within the District; and it is further

RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED, that the maximum amount to be expended for the water improvements within the Sleepy Hollow Water District is hereby increased from Three Hundred Eighty One Thousand Seven Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$381,700.00) to Five Hundred Forty Thousand Two Hundred Twelve and 00/100 Dollars (\$540,212.00) with an estimated cost to the "typical property" of One Thousand Three Hundred Six and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,306.00) annually and the plan of financing includes the issuance of bonds of the Town to finance said cost and the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments from the several lots and parcels of land within the District, which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefitted thereby, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit conferred upon the same, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable, all as shown on the attached financing plan (Schedule "B") as set forth in said Map, Plan and Report and further includes a Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) Grant and an anticipated 30-year low interest DWSRF loan; and it is further

**RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED**, that the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the Town, to file and record certified copies of this resolution and such other documents and instruments as may be required by law; and it is further;

**RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED**, that the construction of water improvements within the District and the increase in the maximum amount to be expended shall be subject to approval of the New York State Comptroller as required by Town Law; and it is further

**RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED**, that the Supervisor of the Town of Sullivan make application to the New York State Comptroller for approval to increase the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the District; and it is further

**RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED**, that this Resolution and Order shall take effect immediately.

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board has heretofore caused to be prepared and filed for public inspection with the Town Clerk a detailed explanation of how such estimates were computed; and

**WHEREAS**, an order was adopted by the Town Board on May 6, 2020 for the hearing of all persons interested in this matter at a meeting of the Town Board to be held at the Town of Sullivan Town Hall, 7507 Lakeport Road, Chittenango, New York June 3, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. and through the medium of Zoom, to consider an increase in the maximum amount to be expended for

the District Extension and to hear all persons interested in the subject thereof, concerning the same and for such other action on the part of the Town Board with relation thereto as may be required by law, and such public hearing was held as ordered and described above; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board previously gave due consideration to the impact that such construction of Water Improvements may have on the environment and on the basis of such consideration, the Town Board determined that there would be no significant impact on the environmental and issued a Negative Declaration for purposes of SEQRA; and

#### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT

#### RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DETERMINED, that:

- A. The petition aforesaid is signed and acknowledge or proved as required by law and duly complies with the requirements of Section 202-d of the Town Law as to sufficiency of signers and it is otherwise sufficient;

## <u>JEFFREY S. TAYLOR II AND TAYLOR'S WILD ENTERPRISES</u> - PROPOSED PDD FOR A DRIVE-THRU SAFARI

Mr. Jeffrey Taylor was invited to speak by Councilor Jeff Martin relative to the status of his application for a proposed PDD for his commercial business of a drive-thru safari currently operating and located at 7591 Lakeport Road (TM# 33.1-1-.5.2) on lands partially zoned Business and partially Agricultural (majority). Mr. Taylor stated that he would soon have the drawings ready to be included with his application for a PDD under the Town's Zoning Law. Thereafter, he requested that the Board vote to voluntarily withdraw its lawsuit against him and Taylor's Wild Enterprises for violation of the Town's Land Use Laws and Zoning Ordinance. No vote for this action was taken by the Board.

#### PURCHASE OF DIRT AND ASPHALT ROLLERS

Highway Superintendent Andrew Busa reviewed with the Board a potential purchase from Vantage Equipment of an Ingersoll-Rand dirt roller at an amount not to exceed \$17,000.00 and an Ingersoll-Rand asphalt roller for an amount not to exceed \$6,500.00.
